

PATH Intl. Standards Review Task Force Charter

Task Force Purpose

The PATH Intl. Standards Review Task Force reviews standards for consistency and terminology, grammar and clarity. Makes recommendation for standard changes to the Programs and Standards Oversight Committee where appropriate.

Task Force Regulations

At the beginning of each calendar year, the task force chair and staff liaison discuss the annual objectives for the committee and agree on those assignments and projects that best meet the association's needs, given its strategic priorities.

Decisions should be made in a democratic manner on the basis of full information and free discussion. The committee chair takes part in the discussion but his/her primary job is facilitating open discussion leading to a conclusion or decision.

Task Force Make-Up

The chair of the accreditation committee and the standards oversight committee are members. Other members must be intimately knowledgeable of the standards delineated in the PATH Intl. Standards for Certification and Accreditation.

<u>Term Limits</u>

- The chair serves a one-year term and may be invited by the PATH Intl. staff liaison to serve an additional one-year term. Chairs may serve three one-year terms on the task force as members and then serve an additional one or two years as chair.
- Task force members serve one-year terms. Task force members may be asked by the PATH Intl. staff liaison to serve up to three one-year terms.
- Total service on a task force (combining task force membership and chair responsibilities) shall not exceed five years on any one committee.
