PATH Intl. Vision Statement: PATH Intl. is the global authority, resource and advocate for equine-assisted activities and therapies and the equines in this work that inspires and enriches the human spirit.

About PATH Intl.: PATH Intl. was formed in 1969 as the North American Riding for the Handicapped Association to promote equineassisted activities and therapies (EAAT) for individuals with special needs. Since that time, the association's work to credential professionals and accredit programs has expanded, as have the categories of individuals served through EAAT. Through the work of 866 member centers and more than 4,600 instructors credentialed through PATH Intl., 61,832 children and adults, including nearly 4,000 veterans, find a sense of health, wellness, independence and fun through EAAT. Member centers range from small, one-person programs to large operations with several credentialed instructors and therapists. In addition to horseback riding, a center may offer any number of EAAT such as hippotherapy, carriage driving, interactive vaulting, trail riding, competition and more. Through a wide variety of educational resources, the association helps individuals start and maintain successful programs. There are 55,311 volunteers, 4,666 instructors, 7,672 equines and thousands of contributors from all over the world making a difference in people's lives.

Center Budgets by Size

Working Hard for PATH Intl. Members and the EAAT Industry Worldwide

Instructor Certification: Three levels of riding instructor certification, two levels of driving certification and one level of interactive vaulting certification ensure that instructors have the skill and knowledge to provide safe and effective services.

Accreditation: The PATH Intl. Center Accreditation process ensures that member centers strive for the highest level of safety and proficiency.

International/Regional Conferences: The PATH Intl. Conference and Annual Meeting offers academic sessions, hands-on demonstrations at the Horse Expo and networking opportunities. PATH Intl. Region Conferences offer a more intimate, local conference experience within each region for members to attend educational seminars, connect with others in their geographical region, receive updates on safety standards and share teaching ideas. The region conferences are also excellent outreach opportunities to gain new members and promote awareness of PATH Intl.

Communications: PATH Intl. Strides quarterly magazine, PATH Intl. eNews and other publications provide valuable educational information and updates to the PATH Intl. membership. Additionally, www.pathintl.org offers an indispensable tool for communication with the PATH Intl. membership and the general public.

Industry and Association Awareness: Through attendance at tradeshows and conventions, the PATH Intl. presence is furthering awareness of EAAT in general and most importantly the vital role PATH Intl. plays in credentialing member centers and professionals. PATH Intl. has presented at or had a booth at the American Academy of Family Physicians annual conference, the American Psychological Association convention, the US Pony Club convention, Equine Affaire-Massachusetts and the Rocky Mountain Horse Expo, resulting in approximately 200,000 individuals having an increased awareness of the industry and association.

Mentor Training: The PATH Intl. Mentor Training Workshop assists Instructors-In-Training to link with highly qualified PATH Intl. Certified Instructors to fulfill the required 25 mentored hours for the certification process. This is accomplished by training current PATH Intl. Certified Instructors about the needs of mentees and the responsibilities of being a mentor.

Distance Education: Three courses, Center Accreditation Training, Instructor Self-Study and Volunteer Training, are currently offered through this program. PATH Intl. enhances distance education with our webinar system. More online offerings are coming in this ever-growing initiative.

PATH Intl. Affiliate Partner Program: This program creates partnerships between PATH Intl. and non-commercial organizations that share the PATH Intl. vision and support the PATH Intl. mission.
