

What is Interactive Vaulting?

▶ Interactive Vaulting is an activity in which the participants perform movements on and around the horse. These movements can be very simple such as sitting without holding onto the surcingle or a more elaborate vaulting position such as kneeling or standing on the horse. It all depends on the individual needs of the vaulter.





Interactive Vaulting Horses

Interactive Vaulling Horses must meet specific requirements and undergo specialized trianing. Not all therespeutic riding horses can be used for interactive.

What Kind of Horse do you need? Vaulling

Sound at all three gaits on a circle

Non-reactive back

Non-reactive back

Appropriate height, width and gaits for vaulters

The Certification Process

- Attend a PATH Intl. Interactive Vaulting Workshop
- Be a PATH Intl. Riding Instructor
- · Be 21 years or older
- 50 practice hours, 30 lunging, 20 teaching interactive vaulting
- Application, fee, resume, recommendations, copy of current CPR/First Aid
- Attend onsite certification
