April 2016 APHF Scholarship Program Helps Fund PATH Intl. Riding Instructors

Denver—The Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship International (PATH Intl.) and the American Paint Horse Foundation (APHF) will continue an innovative partnership designed to help train therapeutic riding instructors. This alliance, which was founded in 2013, provides scholarship assistance to potential instructors of therapeutic riding. While open to anyone with skills in equine management, horsemanship, instruction, teaching methods and disabilities, preference for scholarships will be given to medical professionals.

Founded in 1969 to promote equine-assisted activities and therapies for individuals with special needs, more than 4,600 PATH Intl. instructors have helped in excess of 61,000 children and adults, including nearly 4,000 veterans, find strength and independence through involvement with horses. The average cost of registration for a PATH Intl. certification workshop and test, which takes place over three days, is \$800. The American Paint Horse Foundation seeks to assist individuals interested in certification through the application and acceptance of one-time, \$800 scholarships.

The APHF scholarship is open to first-time applicants, and all applicants must be APHA members and PATH Intl. members in good standing. Additionally, candidates must meet the PATH Intl. criteria to become a Registered Level Instructor In Training and have completed at least 10 hours volunteering at a PATH Intl. Premier Accredited Center.

Applications must be recieved at APHA Headquarters by May 1. Applications should be sent to the attention of Laura Jesberg/APHA Therapeutic Riding Scholarship Program. The scholarships will be awarded in August.
